

GOING WEST

Some of the country's most effective practice interiors can be found in Western Canada. Here's a sample selection created by Edmonton-based designer Tim Stensrud



Natural wood seems to be a favourite in western Canadian interiors as seen on these two pages of dental offices. On this page (top), light wood bands a molded drop ceiling, provides multi-paned doors and frames glass bricks for partitions and room dividers in the dental practice belonging to Dr. Heinz Dyck of Calgary. A similar scheme is seen top-right, opposite page in the practice of Dr. Dave Tsujikawa. Three views (below) of Dr. Michael Bennett's practice in Edmonton, AB, feature oak panelling in both reception area and operatories. Colour scheme is monochromatic in pale blue and wing chairs in the waitingroom carry out a traditional theme.





The reception room (top, left) of Dr. Jim Demas of Edmonton, has a very "western" theme with Indian motifs in carpet and wallpaper, and a series of limited edition serigraphs by artist Irene Clar who specializes in native people as subjects. Centre and below, are two views of Dr. Dave Tarry's offices in Calgary. The operatories are clean and dramatic in forest green and ivory with pale pink partitioning. The front desk is panelled in oak with recessed lighting and brass trim, and upholstered furniture is dramatic in a bright blue and purple stripe.
